Precautions for Persons with Pacemakers or Defibrillators

Maintain Distance

Keep the watch at least **20 centimeters (8 inches)** away from your pacemaker or defibrillator when the watch is turned on.

Immediate Action

If you suspect interference, **turn off the watch immediately**.

Additional Precautions

Magnetic Fields

Do not place the watch directly on medical devices or near areas with magnets (such as certain implants) to avoid possible disruption.

Heart Rate Monitoring

The Moto Watch 120 includes a heart rate sensor, but it is **not a medical-grade device**. Do not rely on it for monitoring serious health conditions. Always use **clinically approved devices** as directed by your healthcare provider.

Monitor for Discomfort

If you experience discomfort, unusual symptoms, or interference with implanted medical devices, **stop using the watch immediately** and consult your healthcare provider.
